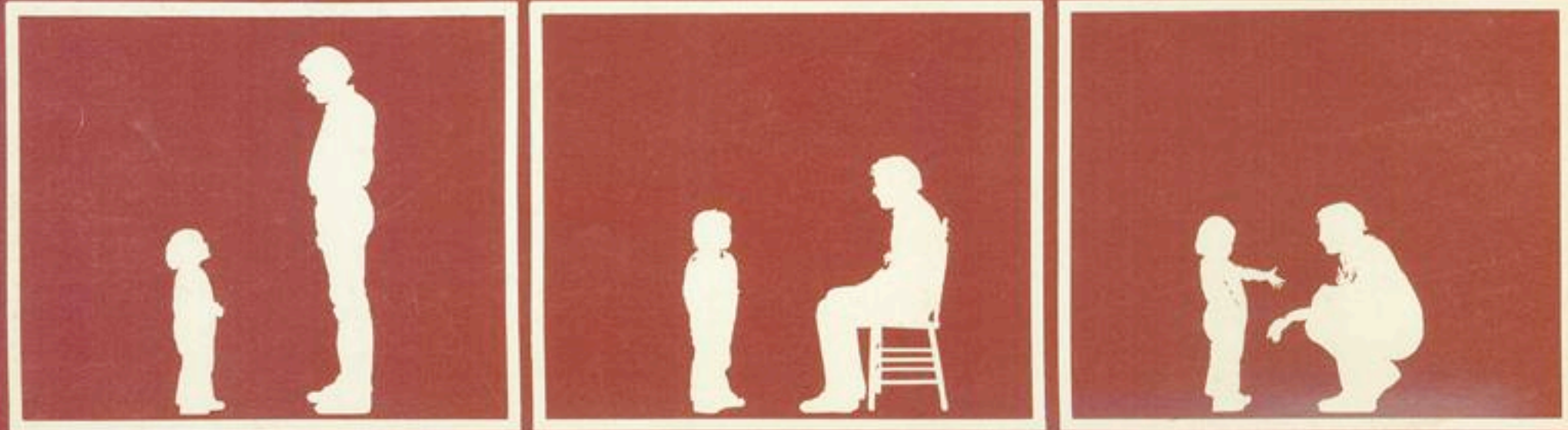


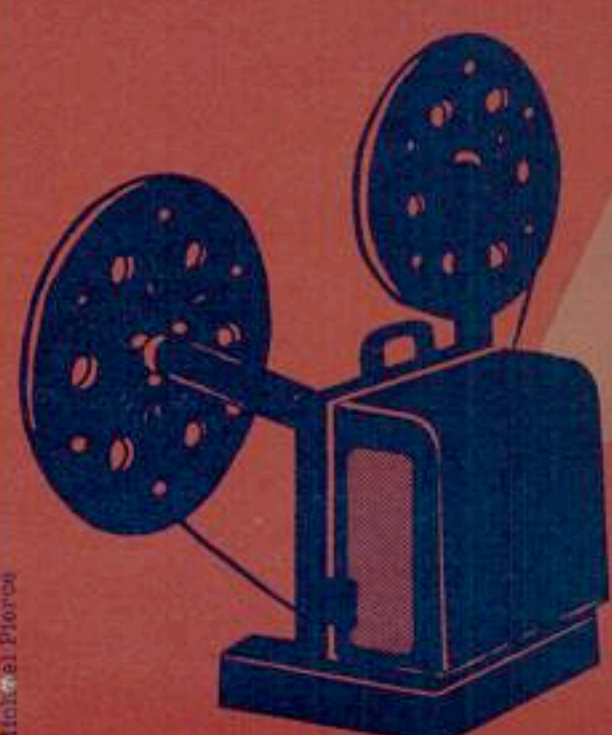

## understanding how children develop

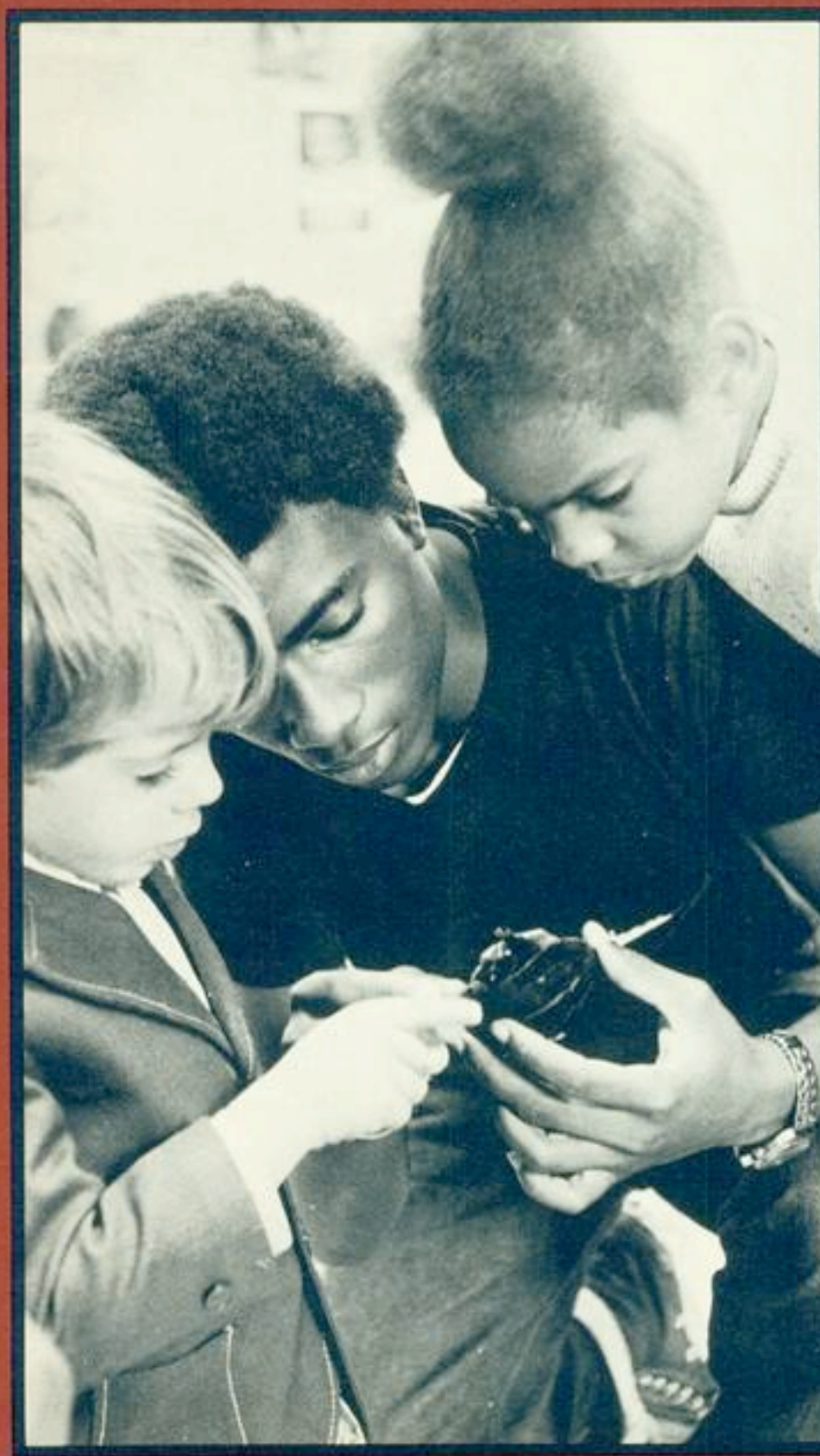


viewing films

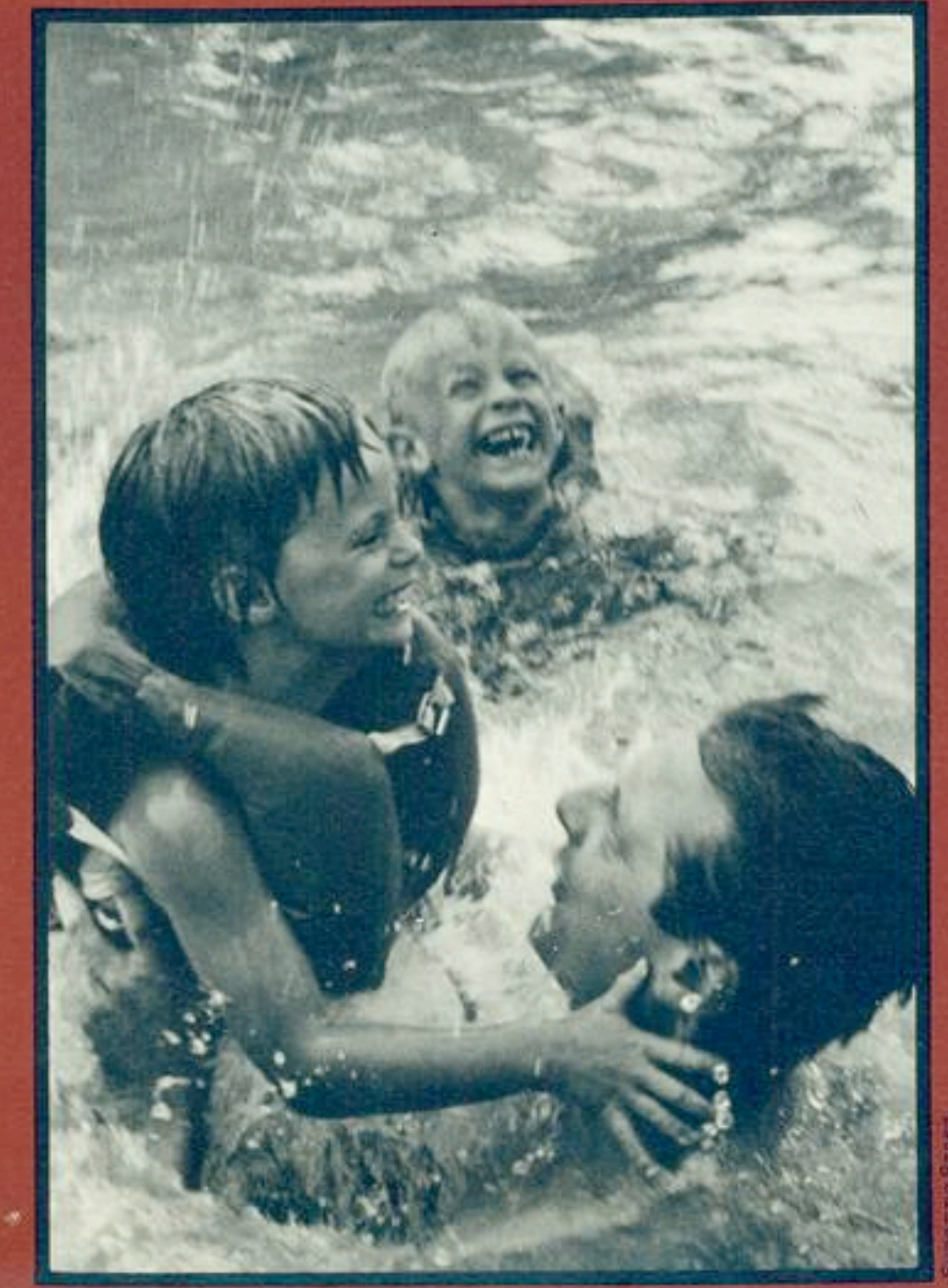
